Annual Fundraiser for St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church, Washington, D.C.

This event was organized at Sts Peter and Paul Antiochian Orthodox Hall to support their new church by raising funds toward their mortgage.

Tatjana Rajic, Mistress of Ceremonies, introduced the honored guests and host His Grace Bishop IRINEJ of the Serbian Orthodox Diocese of Eastern America; Their Royal Highnesses Crown Prince Alexander and Princess Katherine of Serbia; the Honorable Branko Terzic, Royal Adjutant and Member of the Privy Council and Delegate of HRH Crown Prince Alexander of Serbia in the United States; the Honorable Zeljka Cvijanovic, Prime Minister of the Republic of Srpska, Bosnia and Herzegovina; the Honorable Vladimir Marinkovic, National Assembly Deputy Speaker of the Republic of Serbia; Obrad Kesic, Director of the Republic of Srpska Office for Cooperation, Trade and Investment; Mark Rasevic, President of the Trusteeship of St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church; and Rev. This gathering is a celebration of generosity and kindness. We are tremendously grateful to every one of you for your kindness and graciousness in supporting our church community by your presence at this fundraising dinner."

Mark Rasevic, President of the Trusteeship, welcomed everybody to come to "the room where it happens – our Nation's Capital" with the following words: "We come together here this evening to raise funds for our cherished parish, started 57 years ago this upcoming May. Since then, it has experienced most of the same things which all other Serbian Orthodox parishes experienced in the United States: the schism of 1963, holding services in borrowed spaces, the purchase of its first modest worship facility (on 16th St. in NW DC), ecclesiastical and administrative reconciliation of the Serbian Orthodox Church, and then the purchase of our current facility where by the grace of God we were able to complete our building project in 2014 after 13 years of pre-construction & fundraising work. We now find ourselves with a considerable loan of \$2,000,000 (among the highest, if not
